

N.C.T. of Delhi [AIR 2000 SC 3537 [1]], wherein, eccused, facing trial for identical provisions under IP Code, was enlarged on bail by imposing stringent conditions. in view of the fact that he was already in custody from 5/7/1999 to 10/12/1999.




